

Burrito Pillowcase

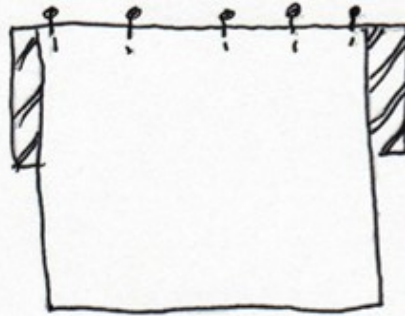


For each (standard size) pillowcase you will need:

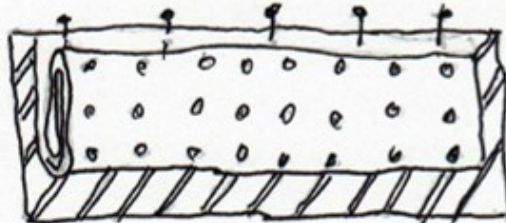
3/4 yd (27") main fabric for body

1/3 yd (12") contrast fabric for cuff

1. Cut the main fabric 27" long by 41" wide.
2. Place the contrast fabric (12" X WOF) right side up on the table.
3. Place the main fabric right side down on top of the contrast fabric, lining up the raw edges. Pin the edges together. (Note that the main fabric is narrower than the contrast fabric. Don't worry about this right now.)



4. Roll up the main fabric ONLY, until about 3" of the contrast fabric is exposed.
5. Fold the exposed contrast fabric over the main fabric roll and line up its raw edge with the raw edge you pinned in Step 4.



6. Re-pin, undoing the original pins as you go and make sure all the raw edges are lined up.
7. Stitch a 1/2" seam along the raw edge.
8. Turn the pillowcase right side out by pulling the main fabric section out through the side opening of the "burrito".
9. Lay flat folding cuff exactly in half and lining up trim seams. You will now have a nice cuff with a little trim sticking out. Trim off the excess cuff and trim fabric.



10. With wrong sides together, line up all the raw edge on the long side and pin together. Sew long edge with 1/4" seam, starting at cuff. Turn case wrong side out and press seam allowance flat. Using a 3/8" seam allowance, sew the long edge again, enclosing the previous seam.
11. Repeat Step 10 with the short end. Line up all the raw edge on the short side and pin together. Sew short edge with 1/4" seam, starting at seam. Turn case wrong side out and press seam allowance flat. Using a 3/8" seam allowance, sew the short edge again, enclosing the previous seam.
12. Turn case right side out, press.
